She had been selected as the Jr. Women's Club Homemaker of the Year of 1959-1960. She attended the College of the Desert upper desert campus, and completed an Associate of Arts degree. She was one of the first volunteers for the Twentynine Palms Citizens Patrol. She served on the Committee of her grandson's Cub Scout Pack. And for many years, she had been a member of the First Baptist Church of Twenty-nine Palms.

She enjoyed so much about Twenty-nine Palms. She was a member of the Historical Society, visited shows at the Art Guild, attended many local events and parades. She was a patron of Theatre 29, and enthusiastically attended the variety of plays produced over the years. She avidly read books, and local newspapers and magazines.

Mrs. Shirbroun enjoyed many craft arts. She was accomplished in knitting, crocheting, and sewed many of her family's clothes. She also enjoyed preparing and preserving foods, often presenting them as gifts to friends and family.
