After graduating from Barstow High School, Stephen worked a few jobs, and at the age of twenty-two, he joined the U.S. Army and served with distinction for twenty-three years. Among his many distinguished honors, Stephen was a recipient of two [Bronze Star](#) Medals, the Army Commendation Medal with V device, eight Army Commendation Medals, [Purple Heart](#), eight Army Achievement Medals, and two Joint Meritorious Unit Awards. Stephen served as a combat medic and combat medic trainee. He served in Germany, Korea, Bosnia, Operation Desert Desert Storm (Kuwait), and three deployments to Iraq. As a teenager, Stephen loved his "head-banger," heavy metal music, and loved to ride dirt bikes on the hills of Barstow, California. As an adult, he continued to listen to heavy metal music and traded dirt bikes for golf clubs. Stephen was a member of the Masons. Stephen is survived by his wife, Anglia; his daughter, Shannon Morrissey (Nick); his father, Frank; his siblings: Linda Soza Carbajal; Ruben Soza (Shirley); Patty Araujo (Albert); Frank Soza ( Pachita); Anna Gutierrez (Jose); Theresa Acosta (Stanley); many nieces and nephews and great-nieces and nephews.
