Carol loved animals, especially her two Springer Spaniels, Fergie and Charlie. She volunteered as an income tax preparer for senior citizens and participated in community and political activities. She was a member of the First United Methodist Church and actively served in various ministries, including Church Finance, Christian Education, and Missions. She had just recently written an article commemorating the 50th anniversary of the church. She is survived by her two sons, Richard of San Diego and Howard of Parker, Colo. She has three grandchildren: Nicolle Tomlinson of Santee, Calif., Matthew Towt of San Diego and Christopher Towt of Parker, Colo.
